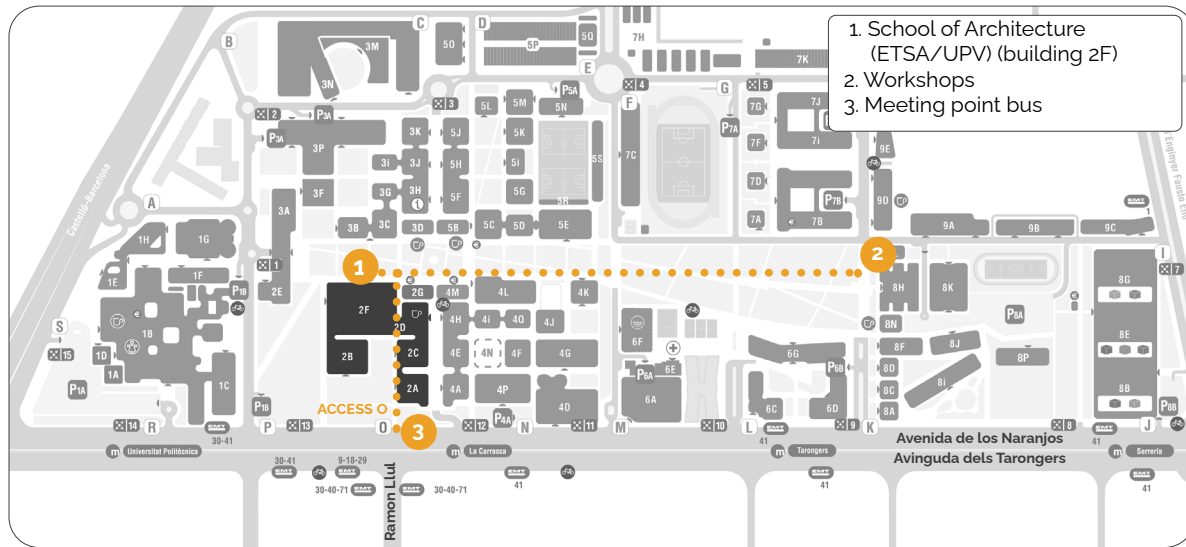

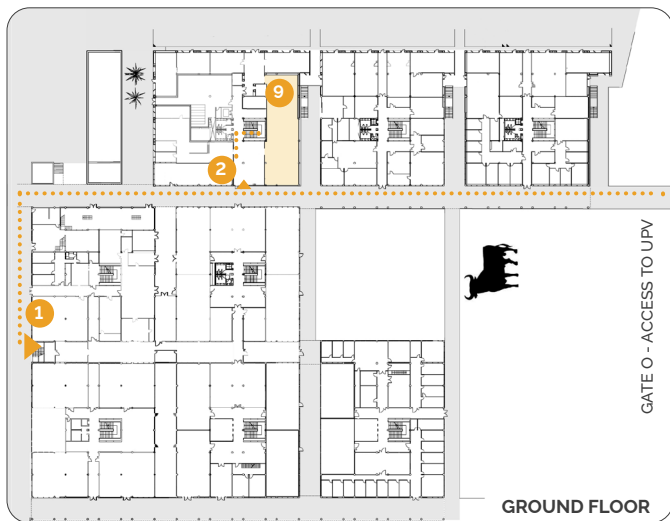

Once inside the campus, please follow the indications to get to the info-registration point of the Conference.



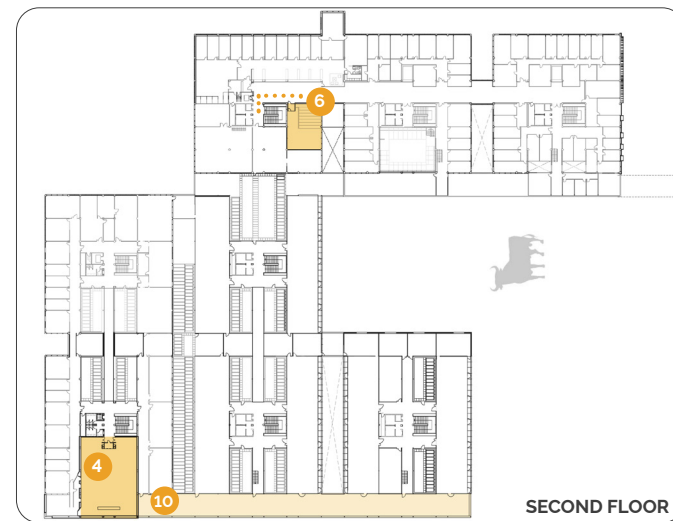

The visit will include the ruins under restoration of the castle of Petrés, official residence of Marshal Suchet during the Napoleonic invasion, built with rammed earth walls and limecrete and tile vaults; the ruins under restoration of the castle of La Vilavella; the pantheon of the Soriano-Manzanet family in Vila-Real, recently built with vaults; the Garden of Memory in Vinaroz, which evokes a demolished monastery with its own rubble and archaeological finds; and the Torre de Cáliz, a medieval tower with a long history of uses and transformations that became the town's discotheque, whose restoration has opted to respect much of its stratification and historical phases. Only the Castle of La Vilavella foresees a slightly uphill rural path.

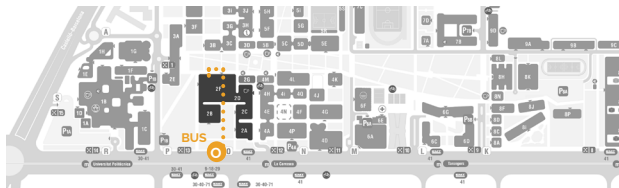

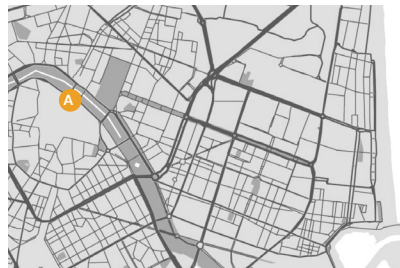

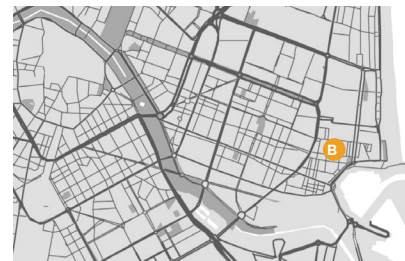
